

# HTFJC FY25 Annual Report



# The Realities

- Johnson County remains one of the most expensive places to live in Iowa.
- Housing Wage is \$21.25 per hour - to rent a two-bedroom apartment (\$1,105/month).
  - **Annual** income required \$44,200
  - 2.9 full time jobs at minimum wage
- Estimated hourly mean wage of renter working full time is \$13.65.
  - Affordable rent is \$710.
  - 1.6 full time jobs to rent two-bedroom apartment at hourly mean renter wage.

# Affordable Rent (2025)

- 100% Annual AMI = \$118,200 for a household with four people –
  - Affordable rent is \$2,955
- 30% AMI income = \$35,460 for a household with four people –
  - Affordable rent is \$887
- Person receiving Supplemental Security Income (little to no income or resources and has a disability or are 65 years of age or older) –
  - Affordable rent is \$377


## FY25 Funded Revolving Loan Program

  - 7 new homeownership households




# FY25 Funded - Income Levels Served

# FY25 Funded by Type of Award








# FY25 Awarded - Income Levels
